Course content

This course deals with:

- •Essential concepts and theories from a feminist and an anti-racist perspective.
- •Honour culture manifestation in a global perspective; UN documentation on occurrence; research on occurrence and spreading; UN stand against crime in the name of honour (the Crimes of Honour UN Resolution).
- •The discourse in Sweden and in the Nordic countries on honour culture manifestation and violence in the name of honour.
- •Interpretations of the behaviour of girls and boys and their life situations and conditions based on theories of the value systems and logic of honour cultures.
- •Perspectives that facilitate the recognition of honour culture contexts and allow problematisation of these perspectives from the viewpoint of alternative interpretations.
- •The relationship between social values, intraprofessional norms and personal experience.
- •The problematising of social work with girls and boys who show indications of having honour culture problems.

Learning outcomes

Upon completion of the course the student shall be able to:

- give an account of honour culture values and logic as presented in different theories
- •interpret the conditions, life situation and experiences of girls and boys seen from a child's perspective, a feminist perspective and an anti-racist perspective
- •analyse and reconstruct the conditions and life situation of young people in what can be interpreted as

honour culture contexts

•critically examine the prevailing professional terminology and concepts from a youth perspective.

Education

Instruction is in the form of lectures and seminars.

Forms of examination

Examination is by individual written tasks and/or oral reporting.

Grading is individual and related to specified learning outcomes according to the following scale:

- A Excellent outstanding performance with only minor errors
- B Very good above average standard but with some errors
- C Good generally sound work but with a number of notable errors
- D Satisfactory fair but with significant shortcomings
- E Sufficient performance meets the minimum criteria
- Fx Fail some more work required before the credit can be awarded
- F Fail considerable further work required

To pass the course students must have obtained at least a grade E in examinations and have actively participated in seminars and group tasks if any.

Information on grading criteria and forms of examination will be distributed at the start of the course.

For information on the rules for examination and re-examination as approved by the Board of the Department of Social Work see separate information sheet.

Students have the right to request re-examination with another examiner if failed twice. Such requests must be made in writing to the director of studies no later than one year after the latest event.
